

Down Memory Lane



In a delightful discovery that has charmed both learners and staff, Union High School has recently unearthed a treasured piece of history: a supplement from the Graaff-Reinet Advertiser dating back to the 1985 Interschools between Union and Volkskool.

This 40-year-old collection of pages offers a nostalgic glimpse into a tradition that has shaped the character and camaraderie of these two institutions.

Among the yellowed pages, anecdotes abound about the beloved annual Interschools dance, a highlight held in the town hall that brought the community together in joyous celebration.

The supplement also highlights the immense hospitality efforts required to cater for the influx of 5000 visitors.

Articles detail the logistical challenges and the community's commendable efforts to ensure everyone felt welcomed and comfortable, painting a picture of a town united by pride and tradition.

In addition to these stories, the supplement offers a rich history of the Interschools event itself, proudly noted as the **oldest of its kind in the Eastern Cape**. This historical account deepens the appreciation for the event's significance, underscoring the enduring legacy of friendly competition and mutual respect between Union and Volkskool.

To preserve this precious find, the supplement has been elegantly framed. The front of the frame showcases articles dedicated to Union Schools, while the back celebrates Volkskool, ensuring both schools' legacies are honoured and remembered.

The discovery of this supplement has not only provided a fascinating look into the past but has also reinforced what this specific event has meant to Union and Volkskool over the years. ***It serves as a testament to the enduring spirit of community, tradition and the shared history that continues to bind these two schools together.***

His strong understanding of schools' rugby further enhances our programme, as he brings valuable insights and strategies to elevate our team's performance.
