

R150 000 x 10% = R15 000

Lloyd Collett matriculated from Union in the year 2000 and went on to complete a BComm in Financial Management at Stellenbosch University.

His professional journey has taken him across continents and industries, with earlier roles in sales in both Scotland and the USA, before returning to South Africa where he gained extensive experience in agricultural finance and consulting.

Lloyd was previously a partner at ACS Consulting, where he advised dairy farmers on everything from pasture and financial management to budgeting, tax, and succession planning. He also served as Head of Finance and Administration at Amadlelo Agri.

Currently, Lloyd is a sharefarmer at Bloekomlaan Agri, a thriving dairy business situated 30km outside of Humansdorp towards Tsitsikamma.

With 1 800 cows under his care, Lloyd and his team are committed to becoming one of the most efficient, low-cost dairy producers in the region – a goal they are pursuing through strategic decision-making and an emphasis on staff empowerment and well-being.

Lloyd is married to Beth, and together they are raising two boys - Joshua (10) and Oliver (8).

Celebrating Mike Hobson: Union High's Class of 1997

From the quiet farmlands of Careysbrook near Jansenville to the skies above foreign lands, Old Unionite Mike Hobson's journey is a remarkable testament to the power of hard work, resilience and daring to dream.

Born in Graaff-Reinet in 1979 and raised on a farm just 25 minutes from Jansenville, Mike's story began humbly - and from the very start, his Union High School roots ran deep.

During his time at Union, Mike distinguished himself not only as a capable student, but also as an outstanding sportsman. A proud member of the Class of 1997, he played hooker for the school's rugby team, earning full colours for both rugby and shooting.

One of the defining highlights of his school years was being part of the side that claimed a long-awaited victory in the 1997 interschools rugby match - Union's first in nearly a decade. That moment remains one of his most cherished memories.

After matriculating, Mike charted a bold new path by moving to the United States.

There, he enlisted in the US Air Force, setting in motion an extraordinary career. His potential was soon recognised and he was nominated and accepted into the prestigious United States Air Force Academy.

Graduating in 2005 with a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering, Mike continued to shine on the rugby field, representing the Academy all four years and earning three selections to the Collegiate All-Americans - a group made up of the best college rugby players in the country. **In 2005, his team clinched the Collegiate National Championship, crowning them the top college rugby side in the United States.**

Mike's rugby career also extended to the international stage. He proudly represented the US national rugby team, earning his cap in a match against Romania and touring countries like Ireland, Italy, and Japan - all while honouring his roots and representing his adopted nation with pride.

Following his graduation, Mike was commissioned as an officer and began pilot training, eventually taking to the skies in the legendary A-10 Warthog.

He served two combat tours in Afghanistan, accumulating over 830 combat hours and receiving ten Air Medals for aerial achievement - a reflection of his courage, precision and unwavering dedication to his mission and team.

In 2015, he took on a new challenge as part of the pioneering cadre for the US Air Force's F-35 fighter jet programme. As an instructor, he helped shape the next generation of pilots until his retirement in December 2024, completing 25 and a half years of distinguished military service. **He retired with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.**

Today, Mike continues to follow his passion for flight as an airline pilot with Southwest Airlines. Based in Phoenix, Arizona, he enjoys a fulfilling life alongside his wife Andrea, a devoted neonatal doctor, and their three daughters - Isla, Reagan and Harper - who are each thriving in club soccer and embracing the same spirit of determination and teamwork that defines their father.

Mike Hobson's story is more than a personal success - it's a message to every Old Unionite and every learner walking the corridors of Union High School: no dream is too distant. From that legendary win on the rugby field to combat missions and shaping future leaders, Mike has shown that with grit, courage and heart, you can rise from the Karoo to conquer the skies.

His journey is one to be proud of - a legacy that inspires, uplifts and proves that your beginnings don't limit your destination. Keep reaching, keep dreaming and always remember: your Union roots can take you anywhere.




